Awards are given where the total distance driven is over 5,000km or 3,000 ml.

As a result of Covid 19 lockdowns, this period will only require 4,150km's or 2,490 miles to qualify.

Long Distance Award Rules

The purpose of this “event” is to encourage MOCA members to enjoy their classic Morgan for fellow enthusiasts, their personal pride, and for the enjoyment of the general public. By driving our Morgan as much as possible we are consistently bringing to mind the love we have for these classic British Sports Cars.

To help and encourage all participants the Morgan Owners Club of Australia offers a “Long Distance Award”. This reward, a small “dash plaque” with the participant’s name and vehicle particulars, along with year involved (e.g. 2020) and the distance travelled during the September 1 through August 31 “MOCA year” (e.g. 5455 km).

The logistics rules are:

1. Distance travelled must be more than 5000 km or 3000 miles during the “season” from September 1 through August 31 or as determined by Covid 19 lockdown period amendments.
2. Vehicles participating must not be ‘daily drivers’ but can be classics other than a Morgan. (Final decision of validity is the responsibility of the Club Captain, State Vice President, or President).
3. Owners of more than one Morgan / classic can combine the distance travelled in each Morgan / classic to reach the requisite distance – however plaque is given to the classic travelling the most distance.
4. The contest is open to all Life, Full, Family and Associate members in good standing of MOCA. **Only one plaque is awarded per driver.**
5. Note members who plan on claiming long distance awards should accurately record their car(s) odometer readings on or after September 1 of each year to ensure they have an accurate reading on or before August 31 of the following year. The “honour system” is used to collect data.
6. Any and all defective odometer gauges are the responsibility of the car’s owner/driver to repair. Estimates of distance travelled will be accepted, odometer reading may be challenged and odometers inspected by a committee member.
7. Dash plaques will contain the driver’s name, car’s make, model & year (if practical), contest year, and distance driven.
8. Dash plaques will be given out as soon as possible after the conclusion of the grace period (September 1 to September 30). Requests for plaques after the grace period will not be accepted.
9. Completed forms must be sent in to MOCA via your MOCA State VP or directly to the Club Captain for consideration. Verbal information will not be accepted. Emailed entries to the Club Captain can be made if they include all information requested on the award form(s).
