1 CONCESSIONAL AND CONDITIONAL REGISTRATION SCHEMES

1.1 New South Wales

1.1.1 Helping you through the process

- In NSW, MOCA participates in the Historic Vehicle Scheme (HVS), and the Classic Vehicle Scheme (CVS). Members participating in the schemes must comply with the requirements of the relevant scheme, as published by Transport NSW.
- The MOCA Conditional Registration Inspector in NSW is the primary point of contact at MOCA to assist you along the way. They also have the important role of acting on behalf of MOCA in relation to participation in the schemes.
- MOCA participates in the Transport for NSW logbook scheme and requires members to maintain a logbook. Details on how to apply for a logbook and when and how to use it are explained on the Transport for NSW website.

1.1.2 Historic Vehicles

- The Historic Vehicle scheme is for vehicles over 30 years of age that are as close to original condition as possible with certain exceptions defined on the Transport for NSW website.
- The following checklist and information may assist you as you check the requirements on the NSW Government website and gather supporting documentation for your application:
 - Are you a financial member of MOCA?
 - Do you have documentation to show the vehicle is at least 30 years of age?
 - Have you checked the requirements relating to originality, period accessories and options that have been fitted on your car and have appropriate documentation?
 - Do you have your eSafety inspection report (Pink slip) and former NSW registration papers ready?
 - If the vehicle has been brought into NSW from another state or territory, or from overseas, do you have an Authorised Unregistered Vehicle Inspection Scheme (AUVIS) report (known as a blue slip)?
 - Have you completed the Transport for NSW Application for Conditional Registration form?
 - Have you completed the MOCA Historical Vehicle Scheme Declaration?
 - Have you completed the Transport for NSW Historic Vehicle Declaration form?
 - At renewal do you have an eSafety inspection, Historic Vehicle Declaration and any Transport for NSW documents required for signing by the Conditional Registration Inspector(s)?

1.1.3 Classic Vehicles

- The Classic Vehicle scheme is for vehicles over 30 years of age that have modifications that would prevent them being registered as an Historic Vehicle.
- The following checklist and information may assist you as you check the requirements on the NSW Government website and gather supporting documentation for your application:
 - Are you a financial member of MOCA?
 - Do you have documentation to show the vehicle is at least 30 years of age?

- Are you able to provide an Authorised Unregistered Vehicle Inspection Scheme (AUVIS) report (known as a blue slip)?
- Do you have certification from an authorised Motor Vehicle Engineer for any modifications requiring certification under the Vehicle Safety and Compliance Certification Scheme
- Have you completed the Transport for NSW Application for Conditional Registration form?
- Have you completed the CMC checklist for CVS registration?
- Have you completed your Transport for NSW Classic Vehicle Declaration?
- At renewal you will need an eSafety inspection, Transport for NSW Classic Vehicle Declaration form and any other Transport for NSW documents required for signing by the Conditional Registration Inspector(s).

1.2 South Australia

1.2.1 Helping you through the process

- In SA, MOCA participates in the Conditional Registration Scheme for historic, left-hand drive, street rod and individually constructed vehicles.
- Members participating in the scheme are required to comply with the latest Code of Practice for Historic Vehicles issued by the Department of Infrastructure and Transport.
- Members who wish to apply must have approval from the Conditional Registration Inspector SA.

1.2.2 Checklist

Members who wish to participate in the Conditional Historic Registration Scheme are required to:

- Be a financial member of MOCA,
- Present their vehicle for inspection,
- Complete a Statutory Declaration,
- Complete the form Approval for Conditional Registration,
- Have log book and registration signed and stamped by a Conditional Registration Inspector (SA),
- Present their vehicle every 3 years for inspection.

1.3 Western Australia

1.3.1 Helping you through the process

- In WA, MOCA participates in the Historic Vehicles (code 404) and Classics (C4C) schemes.
- Members participating in the schemes are required to comply with the requirements of the relevant scheme, as published by the Department of Transport WA.
- Members who wish to apply must have approval from the Conditional Registration Inspector WA.

1.3.2 Process for application

Members who wish to participate in the Concession Registration Schemes are required to:

- Present their membership card to show they are a financial member of MOCA.
- For Historic, provide the Concessional Registration Inspector a completed MOCA Historic Vehicle Scheme Declaration WA.
- Provide a copy of the CMC (WA) Certificate of Financial Membership form to be completed by the Concessional Registration Inspector.
- Present their vehicle for inspection together with the above forms.
- Advise the Concessional Registration Inspector WA of the registration details once registration has been completed.
- Present their vehicle from time to time for inspection if requested.
